Child and Family Therapist Job Description

About the organization...

First established in 2009 and accredited by the National Children's Alliance (<https://www.nationalchildrensalliance.org>) in 2016, the Cornerstone Child Advocacy Center (CAC) ensures that children disclosing abuse are not further victimized by the intervention systems designed to protect them. CACs are child-focused, facility-based programs with representatives from many disciplines working together to effectively investigate, prosecute, and treat child abuse. CAC locations are not only child-focused but designed to create a sense of safety and security for child victims. The Cornerstone CAC is a program of Cornerstone Family Interventions, Inc., a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit organization serving Boone and Lincoln Counties with offices in Madison and Hamlin. Cornerstone CAC is a member of the West Virginia Child Advocacy Network.

About the position...

The Child and Family Therapist provides therapy for non-offending caregivers and/or child victims of abuse in Boone and Lincoln Counties.

The Child and Family Therapist position is full-time. The work schedule is typically Monday-Friday from 8:00 AM–5:00 PM with occasional evening and weekend hours when needed for special events or emergency cases. The therapist will perform duties in both our Boone and Lincoln offices. In-home or school visits may be considered if no transportation is available and the therapist deems it appropriate.

Compensation and Benefits...

Compensation: \$45,000-48,000

Benefits will include paid holidays, paid time off, a portion of the employee's health insurance premium, and a retirement option. Compensation will be based on candidate qualifications, prior experience, and availability of funding.

Job responsibilities include...

Duties (including but not limited to):

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The child and family therapist will provide evidenced-based behavioral interventions and therapeutic strategies to victims of crime and nonoffending caregivers which will include: individual, group and family therapy, case management and discharge planning, treatment planning and reviews, and completing psychosocial assessments.

The therapist will maintain all clinical documentation in accordance with regulatory and accrediting standards.

The therapist will also:

1. Actively participate in multidisciplinary reviews and treatment team meetings as necessary
2. Providing court testimony in criminal and child and neglect proceedings as necessary
3. Attend trainings that are relevant to the position and will improve the therapist's skills
4. Track outcomes and contribute to data collection and grant reporting
5. Participate in peer review, community education, and outreach activities
6. Supervise volunteers and interns
7. Stay abreast of current research and best practices in trauma informed mental health
8. Contribute to a dynamic and collaborative work environment
9. Perform other duties as assigned by the Executive Director

Qualifications:

Master's degree in behavioral health required (psychology, counseling, or social work)

Two years of experience working with abused children and /or families impacted by violence preferred

Strong interpersonal and engagement skills, listening, communication, and crisis management skills required

Ability to work with a multidisciplinary team with a willingness to appreciate different points of view a problem solve in a constructive manner

Strong written and verbal communication skills needed

Strong computer skills

Dependable transportation with car insurance

Certificates, License, Registration...

This position requires a licensed (or license-eligible) degree (Temporary Social Work Permit, LGSW, LCSW, LICSW, Provisionally Licensed Counselor, LPC, or Licensed Psychologist)
